BNAPS Supports Schneider Trophy Contest 80th Anniversary Flypast

On 13 September 2011 the 80th anniversary of the last Schneider Contest, held in 1931, will be celebrated by a seaplane fly past around the Solent. The event has been inspired by Capt John Russell who operates his Cessna 182 seaplane G-ESSL with Euro Seaplane Services and the associated Seaplane Club. G-ESSL is often seen flying in the local area from time to time. The Schneider Trophy contests spurred on the development of aircraft and aero engine technology from the first contest in 1913 with aircraft barely able to achieve more than 100mph, to the triumphant Supermarine S6B and its magnificent Rolls Royce "R" type engine that enabled the Schneider Trophy to be won outright for Britain in 1931 and shortly afterwards won the World Air Speed record at a speed of 407mph. The 1931 contest required the competing seaplanes to fly around a course over the Solent with the finishing line off Ryde Pier. It is reckoned that over half a million spectators turned out to view the contest.



The commemoration fly-past will consist of 5 or maybe 6 seaplanes making three circuits of a slightly modified version of the 1931 course in the period from 12 noon to 2pm on Tuesday 13 September. If weather conditions are unsuitable on the 13 September, then the fly-past will be held on the following day, a go/no go decision for the fly-past will be made at 09:00 on the day.



BNAPS Supporters club members Pete Jenness and Noel Stimson will be supporting this event by manning the Schneider 80 fly-past co-ordination centre set up at the Ryde Hovertravel Terminal. BNAPS Trustee Bob Wealthy has been helping John Russell with publicity and local contacts and will be at Ryde Pier Head along with John Kenyon as the Schneider 80 reps on the day. The participating seaplanes have an amphibious capability and will be operating from Daedalus Airfield, Lee-on-the-Solent. Sea conditions permitting the participating seaplanes may elect to make water touch downs off Ryde Pier and Calshot and possibly come ashore at Calshot. It is anticipated that there will be coverage of the event by BBC TV and other news media.

East Wight Workshop Refurbishment Now Well Underway

VCN Parts Cataloguing and Condition Survey Nears Completion

Concentrated effort has been applied to this task over the past 2 months and the end is in sight. From the initial condition assessment it appears that a higher proportion than anticipated of the detail parts may have suffered during outside storage to an extent where it is better to replace than attempt reuse.

The cataloguing exercise is absolutely vital to minimise wasted effort downstream such that immediate action can be taken to seek out replacements in anticipation of the stage when they will be needed later on in the restoration programme

Charlie November "Fly or No Fly" Restoration Policy

The question of whether "Charlie November" should be restored to flying condition is the subject of intensive study by the BNAPS Trustees with advice being sought from the CAA and those with direct aircraft engineering experience of working with B-N Islanders.

Whilst the essential nature of the Islander's design means that the airframe has for all practical purposes an indefinite life, the implications of present day regulations that now apply to aircraft construction and operation are of major concern with regards to the cost involved and the time needed to do the work with relatively limited facilities and resources.

BNAPS Trustees recently met with Robert Pleming of the Vulcan to the Sky Trust who came over to the Propeller Inn and gave a comprehensive briefing on the trials and tribulations of getting a historic aircraft back to flying condition. This opportunity arose as a result of the BAPC meeting in May this year and BNAPS is very grateful that Robert Pleming was willing to take the time out to help in this way.

From the investigation work done so far, involved initial discussions with CAA contacts, consultation with experienced B-N aircraft engineers a restoration to fly could be considered as technically feasible. However it is apparent that BNAPS would have to turn into a different type of organisation with access to substantial finance to achieve this aim.

BNAPS Board of Trustees now has much of the information required to declare the basic principles of the restoration policy for "Charlie November". A fundamental part of this policy is the intention to have the aircraft ready in time for celebration of the Prototype Islander's first flight 50th anniversary in June 2015. In parallel with the restoration work a BNAPS working group will be set up investigate possibilities to identify suitable premises that would allow the restored "Charlie November" to be put on public display as a tribute to the imagination and enterprise of John Britten and Desmond Norman.

BNAPS on the web

In the near future it is envisaged that BNAPS will create and maintain its own website covering news, progress reports, related articles and on-line sales facilities.
